About The Accord Symphony Orchestra

The Accord Symphony Orchestra (Accord), in partnership with Washington Conservatory of Music, is a dynamic and inclusive group led by Music Director/Conductor Julien Benichou. Accord presents an annual season of 10 diverse performances across the DMV, show-casing classical masterworks, sacred music, oratorios, pops, opera, and GoGo collaborations. The orchestra engages audiences with interactive programming, call-and-response moments, and pre/post-concert talks. Committed to representing a diverse community, Accord performs in underserved communities and champions repertoire from underrepresented musicians and artists. Its members include professional, student, and amateur musicians, ranging from retired military personnel to educators and engineers with musical expertise. Accord nurtures emerging talent through professional coaching, mentorship, and lessons, while offering opportunities for both local and nationally recognized vocalists. The orchestra has hosted an annual concerto competition which has featured dozens of talented youth and musicians alike in concertos with the orchestra.

In 2024, Accord's chamber ensemble returned to the Embassies of Spain, Great Britain and France in addition to being featured on Kennedy Center's Millennium Stage for a celebrated performance. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Accord sustained music-making through innovative collaborations with groups such as Camerata Baltimore, the National United Methodist Festival Choir, Carter Legacy Singers and more, exemplifying resili-ence and dedication to its mission of breaking barriers and making music accessible to all.
